*/ˈsɪvəlɪzd/* *adjective* - at an advanced stage of social and cultural development "a civilized society" polite and well-mannered. "I went to talk to them and we had a very civilized conversation"

**Similar:** enlightened. Educated. Advanced. Developed. Cultured

**Opposite:** uncivilized. barbaric
